

## **'Miracles of Jesus/Yeshua' in the Gospels**

### Blind men healed (At Capernaum)

**Matthew 9:27-31** *As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed Him, crying out, "Have mercy on us, Son of David!"*

(28) *When He entered the house, the blind men came up to Him, and Jesus \*said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They \*said to Him, "Yes, Lord."*

(29) *Then He touched their eyes, saying, "It shall be done to you according to your faith."*

(30) *And their eyes were opened. And Jesus sternly warned them: "See that no one knows about this!"*

(31) *But they went out and spread the news about Him throughout all that land.*

### Dumb demon possessed man healed (At Capernaum)

**Matthew 9:32** *As they were going out, a mute, demon-possessed man was brought to Him.*

(33) *After the demon was cast out, the mute man spoke; and the crowds were amazed, and were saying, "Nothing like this has ever been seen in Israel."*

(34) *But the Pharisees were saying, "He casts out the demons by the ruler of the demons."*

### Coin in fish's mouth (At Capernaum)

**Matthew 17:24-27** *When they came to Capernaum, those who collected the two-drachma tax came to Peter and said, "Does your teacher not pay the two-drachma tax?"*

(25) *He said, "Yes." And when he came into the house, Jesus spoke to him first, saying, "What do you think, Simon? From whom do the kings of the earth collect customs or poll-tax, from their sons or from strangers?"*

(26) *When Peter said, "From strangers," Jesus said to him, "Then the sons are exempt."*

(27) *"However, so that we do not offend them, go to the sea and throw in a hook, and take the first fish that comes up; and when you open its mouth, you will find a shekel. Take that and give it to them for you and Me."*

### Healing of deaf and dumb man (At Decapolis)

**Mark 7:31-37.** *Again He went out from the region of Tyre, and came through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, within the region of Decapolis.*

(32) *They brought to Him one who was deaf and spoke with difficulty, and they implored Him to lay His hand on him.*

(33) *Jesus took him aside from the crowd, by himself, and put His fingers into his ears, and after spitting, He touched his tongue with the saliva;*

(34) *and looking up to heaven with a deep sigh, He \*said to him, "Ephphatha!" that is, "Be opened!"*

(35) *And his ears were opened, and the impediment of his tongue was removed, and he began speaking plainly.*

(36) *And He gave them orders not to tell anyone; but the more He ordered them, the more widely they continued to proclaim it.*

(37) *They were utterly astonished, saying, "He has done all things well; He makes even the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."*

#### Blind man healed (At Bethsaida)

**Mark 8:22** *And they \*came to Bethsaida. And they \*brought a blind man to Jesus and implored Him to touch him.*

(23) *Taking the blind man by the hand, He brought him out of the village; and after spitting on his eyes and laying His hands on him, He asked him, "Do you see anything?"*

(24) *And he looked up and said, "I see men, for I see them like trees, walking around."*

(25) *Then again He laid His hands on his eyes; and he looked intently and was restored, and began to see everything clearly.*

(26) *And He sent him to his home, saying, "Do not even enter the village."*

#### Yeshua/Jesus leaves multitude unseen (At Nazerath)

**Luke 4:28** *And all the people in the synagogue were filled with rage as they heard these things;*

(29) *and they got up and drove Him out of the city, and led Him to the brow of the hill on which their city had been built, in order to throw Him down the cliff.*

(30) *But passing through their midst, He went His way.*

#### Supernatural catch of fish (At Bethsaida)

**Luke 5:4-7** *When He had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch."*

(5) *Simon answered and said, "Master, we worked hard all night and caught*

*nothing, but I will do as You say and let down the nets."*

*(6) When they had done this, they enclosed a great quantity of fish, and their nets began to break;*

*(7) so they signaled to their partners in the other boat for them to come and help them. And they came and filled both of the boats, so that they began to sink.*

#### The widow's son raised (At Nain)

**Luke 7:11-18** *Soon afterwards He went to a city called Nain; and His disciples were going along with Him, accompanied by a large crowd.*

*(12) Now as He approached the gate of the city, a dead man was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow; and a sizeable crowd from the city was with her.*

*(13) When the Lord saw her, He felt compassion for her, and said to her, "Do not weep."*

*(14) And He came up and touched the coffin; and the bearers came to a halt. And He said, "Young man, I say to you, arise!"*

*(15) The dead man sat up and began to speak. And Jesus gave him back to his mother.*

*(16) Fear gripped them all, and they began glorifying God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen among us!" and, "God has visited His people!"*

*(17) This report concerning Him went out all over Judea and in all the surrounding district.*

*(18) The disciples of John reported to him about all these things.*

#### Woman healed of an infirmity (At Jerusalem)

**Luke 13:10-17** *And He was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath.*

*(11) And there was a woman who for eighteen years had had a sickness caused by a spirit; and she was bent double, and could not straighten up at all.*

*(12) When Jesus saw her, He called her over and said to her, "Woman, you are freed from your sickness."*

*(13) And He laid His hands on her; and immediately she was made erect again and began glorifying God.*

*(14) But the synagogue official, indignant because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath, began saying to the crowd in response, "There are six days in which work should be done; so come during them and get healed, and not on the*

*Sabbath day."*

*(15) But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites, does not each of you on the Sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the stall and lead him away to water him?"*

*(16) "And this woman, a daughter of Abraham as she is, whom Satan has bound for eighteen long years, should she not have been released from this bond on the Sabbath day?"*

*(17) As He said this, all His opponents were being humiliated; and the entire crowd was rejoicing over all the glorious things being done by Him.*

Man with dropsy healed (At Jerusalem)

**Luke 14:1-6** *It happened that when He went into the house of one of the leaders of the Pharisees on the Sabbath to eat bread, they were watching Him closely.*

*(2) And there in front of Him was a man suffering from dropsy.*

*(3) And Jesus answered and spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath, or not?"*

*(4) But they kept silent. And He took hold of him and healed him, and sent him away.*

*(5) And He said to them, "Which one of you will have a son or an ox fall into a well, and will not immediately pull him out on a Sabbath day?"*

*(6) And they could make no reply to this.*

Ten lepers healed (At Samaria)

**Luke 17:11-19** *While He was on the way to Jerusalem, He was passing between Samaria and Galilee.*

*(12) As He entered a village, ten leprous men who stood at a distance met Him;*

*(13) and they raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!"*

*(14) When He saw them, He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they were going, they were cleansed.*

*(15) Now one of them, when he saw that he had been healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice,*

*(16) and he fell on his face at His feet, giving thanks to Him. And he was a Samaritan.*

*(17) Then Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine, where are they?"*

(18) *"Was no one found who returned to give glory to God, except this foreigner?"*

(19) *And He said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has made you well."*

Malchus has his severed ear healed (At Gethsemane)

**Luke 22:50-51** *And one of them struck the slave of the high priest and cut off his right ear.*

(51) *But Jesus answered and said, "Stop! No more of this." And He touched his ear and healed him.*

Water turned to wine (At Cana)

**John 2:1-11** *On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there;*

(2) *and both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding.*

(3) *When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus \*said to Him, "They have no wine."*

(4) *And Jesus \*said to her, "Woman, what does that have to do with us? My hour has not yet come."*

(5) *His mother \*said to the servants, "Whatever He says to you, do it."*

(6) *Now there were six stone waterpots set there for the Jewish custom of purification, containing twenty or thirty gallons each.*

(7) *Jesus \*said to them, "Fill the waterpots with water." So they filled them up to the brim.*

(8) *And He \*said to them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it to him.*

(9) *When the headwaiter tasted the water which had become wine, and did not know where it came from (but the servants who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the bridegroom,*

(10) *and \*said to him, "Every man serves the good wine first, and when the people have drunk freely, then he serves the poorer wine; but you have kept the good wine until now."*

(11) *This beginning of His signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.*

Nobleman's son healed of fever (At Cana)

**John 4:46-54** *Therefore He came again to Cana of Galilee where He had made the water wine. And there was a royal official whose son was sick at Capernaum.*

(47) *When he heard that Jesus had come out of Judea into Galilee, he went to Him and was imploring Him to come down and heal his son; for he was at the point of death.*

(48) *So Jesus said to him, "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you simply will not believe."*

(49) *The royal official said to Him, "Sir, come down before my child dies."*

(50) *Jesus said to him, "Go; your son lives." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and started off.*

(51) *As he was now going down, his slaves met him, saying that his son was living.*

(52) *So he inquired of them the hour when he began to get better. Then they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him."*

(53) *So the father knew that it was at that hour in which Jesus said to him, "Your son lives"; and he himself believed and his whole household.*

(54) *This is again a second sign that Jesus performed when He had come out of Judea into Galilee.*

#### Man ill 38 years healed (At Jerusalem)

**John 5:1-9** *After these things there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.*

(2) *Now there is in Jerusalem by the sheep gate a pool, which is called in Hebrew Bethesda, having five porticoes.*

(3) *In these lay a multitude of those who were sick, blind, lame, and withered, waiting for the moving of the waters;*

(4) *for an angel of the Lord went down at certain seasons into the pool and stirred up the water; whoever then first, after the stirring up of the water, stepped in was made well from whatever disease with which he was afflicted.*

(5) *A man was there who had been ill for thirty-eight years.*

(6) *When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he had already been a long time in that condition, He said to him, "Do you wish to get well?"*

(7) *The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, but while I am coming, another steps down before me."*

(8) *Jesus \*said to him, "Get up, pick up your pallet and walk."*

(9) *Immediately the man became well, and picked up his pallet and began to walk. Now it was the Sabbath on that day.*

#### Man born blind healed (At Jerusalem)

**John 9:1-7** *As He passed by, He saw a man blind from birth.*

(2) *And His disciples asked Him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he would be born blind?"*

(3) *Jesus answered, "It was neither that this man sinned, nor his parents; but it was so that the works of God might be displayed in him.*

(4) *"We must work the works of Him who sent Me as long as it is day; night is coming when no one can work.*

(5) *"While I am in the world, I am the Light of the world."*

(6) *When He had said this, He spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and applied the clay to his eyes,*

(7) *and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which is translated, Sent). So he went away and washed, and came back seeing.*

(see also John 9:8-41)

Lazarus raised from the dead (At Bethany)

**John 11:1-5, 11-14, 17-44** *Now a certain man was sick, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha.*

(2) *It was the Mary who anointed the Lord with ointment, and wiped His feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was sick.*

(3) *So the sisters sent word to Him, saying, "Lord, behold, he whom You love is sick."*

(4) *But when Jesus heard this, He said, "This sickness is not to end in death, but for the glory of God, so that the Son of God may be glorified by it."*

(5) *Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus*

John 11:11-14 *This He said, and after that He \*said to them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep; but I go, so that I may awaken him out of sleep."*

(12) *The disciples then said to Him, "Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will recover."*

(13) *Now Jesus had spoken of his death, but they thought that He was speaking of literal sleep.*

(14) *So Jesus then said to them plainly, "Lazarus is dead,*

John 11:17-44 *So when Jesus came, He found that he had already been in the tomb four days.*

(18) *Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles off;*

(19) *and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary, to console them concerning their brother.*

(20) *Martha therefore, when she heard that Jesus was coming, went to meet Him, but Mary stayed at the house.*

(21) *Martha then said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died.*

(22) *"Even now I know that whatever You ask of God, God will give You."*

(23) *Jesus \*said to her, "Your brother will rise again."*

(24) *Martha \*said to Him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day."*

(25) *Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies,*

(26) *and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?"*

(27) *She \*said to Him, "Yes, Lord; I have believed that You are the Christ, the Son of God, even He who comes into the world."*

(28) *When she had said this, she went away and called Mary her sister, saying secretly, "The Teacher is here and is calling for you."*

(29) *And when she heard it, she got up quickly and was coming to Him.*

(30) *Now Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still in the place where Martha met Him.*

(31) *Then the Jews who were with her in the house, and consoling her, when they saw that Mary got up quickly and went out, they followed her, supposing that she was going to the tomb to weep there.*

(32) *Therefore, when Mary came where Jesus was, she saw Him, and fell at His feet, saying to Him, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died."*

(33) *When Jesus therefore saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, He was deeply moved in spirit and was troubled,*

(34) *and said, "Where have you laid him?" They \*said to Him, "Lord, come and see."*

(35) *Jesus wept.*

(36) *So the Jews were saying, "See how He loved him!"*

(37) *But some of them said, "Could not this man, who opened the eyes of the blind man, have kept this man also from dying?"*

(38) *So Jesus, again being deeply moved within, came to the tomb. Now it was a cave, and a stone was lying against it.*

(39) *Jesus said, "Remove the stone." Martha, the sister of the deceased,*

*\*said to Him, "Lord, by this time there will be a stench, for he has been dead four days."*

*(40) Jesus \*said to her, "Did I not say to you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?"*

*(41) So they removed the stone. Then Jesus raised His eyes, and said, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me.*

*(42) "I knew that You always hear Me; but because of the people standing around I said it, so that they may believe that You sent Me."*

*(43) When He had said these things, He cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth."*

*(44) The man who had died came forth, bound hand and foot with wrappings, and his face was wrapped around with a cloth. Jesus \*said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."*

#### Fish caught supernaturally (At Bethsaida)

**John 21:4-6** *But when the day was now breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus.*

*(5) So Jesus \*said to them, "Children, you do not have any fish, do you?" They answered Him, "No."*

*(6) And He said to them, "Cast the net on the right-hand side of the boat and you will find a catch." So they cast, and then they were not able to haul it in because of the great number of fish.*

#### Canaanite woman's possessed daughter healed (At Tyre)

**Matthew 15:21-28** *Jesus went away from there, and withdrew into the district of Tyre and Sidon.*

*(22) And a Canaanite woman from that region came out and began to cry out, saying, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is cruelly demon-possessed."*

*(23) But He did not answer her a word. And His disciples came and implored Him, saying, "Send her away, because she keeps shouting at us."*

*(24) But He answered and said, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel."*

*Mat 15:25 But she came and began to bow down before Him, saying, "Lord, help me!"*

*(26) And He answered and said, "It is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs."*

*(27) But she said, "Yes, Lord; but even the dogs feed on the crumbs which*

*fall from their masters' table."*

*(28) Then Jesus said to her, "O woman, your faith is great; it shall be done for you as you wish." And her daughter was healed at once.*

#### Feeding of four thousand (At Gennesaret?)

**Matthew 15:32-39** *And Jesus called His disciples to Him, and said, "I feel compassion for the people, because they have remained with Me now three days and have nothing to eat; and I do not want to send them away hungry, for they might faint on the way."*

*(33) The disciples said to Him, "Where would we get so many loaves in this desolate place to satisfy such a large crowd?"*

*(34) And Jesus \*said to them, "How many loaves do you have?" And they said, "Seven, and a few small fish."*

*(35) And He directed the people to sit down on the ground;*

*(36) and He took the seven loaves and the fish; and giving thanks, He broke them and started giving them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people.*

*(37) And they all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up what was left over of the broken pieces, seven large baskets full.*

*(38) And those who ate were four thousand men, besides women and children.*

*(39) And sending away the crowds, Jesus got into the boat and came to the region of Magadan.*

#### Fig tree cursed (At Mount of Olives)

**Matthew 21:17-20** *And He left them and went out of the city to Bethany, and spent the night there.*

*(18) Now in the morning, when He was returning to the city, He became hungry.*

*(19) Seeing a lone fig tree by the road, He came to it and found nothing on it except leaves only; and He said to it, "No longer shall there ever be any fruit from you." And at once the fig tree withered.*

*(20) Seeing this, the disciples were amazed and asked, "How did the fig tree wither all at once.*

#### Centurion's servant healed (At Capernaum)

**Matthew 8:5-13** *And when Jesus entered Capernaum, a centurion came to Him, imploring Him,*

(6) *and saying, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, fearfully tormented."*

(7) *Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him."*

*Mat 8:8 But the centurion said, "Lord, I am not worthy for You to come under my roof, but just say the word, and my servant will be healed.*

(9) *"For I also am a man under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to this one, 'Go!' and he goes, and to another, 'Come!' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this!' and he does it."*

(10) *Now when Jesus heard this, He marveled and said to those who were following, "Truly I say to you, I have not found such great faith with anyone in Israel.*

(11) *"I say to you that many will come from east and west, and recline at the table with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven;*

(12) *but the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into the outer darkness; in that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."*

(13) *And Jesus said to the centurion, "Go; it shall be done for you as you have believed." And the servant was healed that very moment.*

#### Demon possessed blind and mute man healed (At Galilee)

**Matthew 12:22-23** *Then a demon-possessed man who was blind and mute was brought to Jesus, and He healed him, so that the mute man spoke and saw.*

(23) *All the crowds were amazed, and were saying, "This man cannot be the Son of David, can he?"*

#### Man in synagogue has demon cast out (At Capernaum)

**Luke 4:33-37** *In the synagogue there was a man possessed by the spirit of an unclean demon, and he cried out with a loud voice,*

(34) *"Let us alone! What business do we have with each other, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I know who You are, the Holy One of God!"*

(35) *But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be quiet and come out of him!" And when the demon had thrown him down in the midst of the people, he came out of him without doing him any harm.*

(36) *And amazement came upon them all, and they began talking with one another saying, "What is this message? For with authority and power He commands the unclean spirits and they come out."*

(37) *And the report about Him was spreading into every locality in the surrounding district.*

Storm be still (At Sea of Galilee)

**Luke 8:22-25** *Now on one of those days Jesus and His disciples got into a boat, and He said to them, "Let us go over to the other side of the lake." So they launched out.*

(23) *But as they were sailing along He fell asleep; and a fierce gale of wind descended on the lake, and they began to be swamped and to be in danger.*

(24) *They came to Jesus and woke Him up, saying, "Master, Master, we are perishing!" And He got up and rebuked the wind and the surging waves, and they stopped, and it became calm.*

(25) *And He said to them, "Where is your faith?" They were fearful and amazed, saying to one another, "Who then is this, that He commands even the winds and the water, and they obey Him?"*

Demons enter swine (At Gadara)

**Luke 8:26-36** *Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee.*

(27) *And when He came out onto the land, He was met by a man from the city who was possessed with demons; and who had not put on any clothing for a long time, and was not living in a house, but in the tombs.*

(28) *Seeing Jesus, he cried out and fell before Him, and said in a loud voice, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me."*

(29) *For He had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For it had seized him many times; and he was bound with chains and shackles and kept under guard, and yet he would break his bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert.*

(30) *And Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him.*

(31) *They were imploring Him not to command them to go away into the abyss.*

(32) *Now there was a herd of many swine feeding there on the mountain; and the demons implored Him to permit them to enter the swine. And He gave them permission.*

(33) *And the demons came out of the man and entered the swine; and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.*

(34) *When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they ran away and reported it in the city and out in the country.*

(35) *The people went out to see what had happened; and they came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had gone out, sitting down at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind; and they became frightened.*

(36) *Those who had seen it reported to them how the man who was demon-possessed had been made well.*

#### Woman with haemorrhage healed (At Gennesaret)

**Luke 8:43-48** *And a woman who had a hemorrhage for twelve years, and could not be healed by anyone,*

(44) *came up behind Him and touched the fringe of His cloak, and immediately her hemorrhage stopped.*

(45) *And Jesus said, "Who is the one who touched Me?" And while they were all denying it, Peter said, "Master, the people are crowding and pressing in on You."*

(46) *But Jesus said, "Someone did touch Me, for I was aware that power had gone out of Me."*

(47) *When the woman saw that she had not escaped notice, she came trembling and fell down before Him, and declared in the presence of all the people the reason why she had touched Him, and how she had been immediately healed.*

(48) *And He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace.*

#### Daughter of Jairus healed (At Capernaum)

**Luke 8:40-42, 49-56** *And as Jesus returned, the people welcomed Him, for they had all been waiting for Him.*

(41) *And there came a man named Jairus, and he was an official of the synagogue; and he fell at Jesus' feet, and began to implore Him to come to his house;*

(42) *for he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying. But as He went, the crowds were pressing against Him.*

Luke 8:49-56 *While He was still speaking, someone came from the house of the synagogue official, saying, "Your daughter has died; do not trouble the Teacher anymore."*

(50) *But when Jesus heard this, He answered him, "Do not be afraid any*

*longer; only believe, and she will be made well."*

*(51) When He came to the house, He did not allow anyone to enter with Him, except Peter and John and James, and the girl's father and mother.*

*(52) Now they were all weeping and lamenting for her; but He said, "Stop weeping, for she has not died, but is asleep."*

*(53) And they began laughing at Him, knowing that she had died.*

*(54) He, however, took her by the hand and called, saying, "Child, arise!"*

*(55) And her spirit returned, and she got up immediately; and gave orders for something to be given her to eat.*

*(56) Her parents were amazed; but He instructed them to tell no one what had happened.*

#### Man with palsy healed (At Capernaum)

**Luke 5:17-26.** *One day He was teaching; and there were some Pharisees and teachers of the law sitting there, who had come from every village of Galilee and Judea and from Jerusalem; and the power of the Lord was present for Him to perform healing.*

*(18) And some men were carrying on a bed a man who was paralyzed; and they were trying to bring him in and to set him down in front of Him.*

*(19) But not finding any way to bring him in because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and let him down through the tiles with his stretcher, into the middle of the crowd, in front of Jesus.*

*(20) Seeing their faith, He said, "Friend, your sins are forgiven you."*

*(21) The scribes and the Pharisees began to reason, saying, "Who is this man who speaks blasphemies? Who can forgive sins, but God alone?"*

*(22) But Jesus, aware of their reasonings, answered and said to them, "Why are you reasoning in your hearts?"*

*(23) "Which is easier, to say, 'Your sins have been forgiven you,' or to say, 'Get up and walk'?"*

*(24) "But, so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins," He said to the paralytic, "I say to you, get up, and pick up your stretcher and go home."*

*(25) Immediately he got up before them, and picked up what he had been lying on, and went home glorifying God.*

*(26) They were all struck with astonishment and began glorifying God; and they were filled with fear, saying, "We have seen remarkable things today."*

#### Leper healed (At Gennesaret)

**Luke 5:12-14** *While He was in one of the cities, behold, there was a man covered with leprosy; and when he saw Jesus, he fell on his face and implored Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."*

(13) *And He stretched out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." And immediately the leprosy left him.*

(14) *And He ordered him to tell no one, "But go and show yourself to the priest and make an offering for your cleansing, just as Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.*

Peter's mother-in-law healed (At Bethsaida)

**Luke 4:38-39** *Then He got up and left the synagogue, and entered Simon's home. Now Simon's mother-in-law was suffering from a high fever, and they asked Him to help her.*

(39) *And standing over her, He rebuked the fever, and it left her; and she immediately got up and waited on them.*

Man with withered hand healed (At Capernaum)

**Luke 6:6-11** *On another Sabbath He entered the synagogue and was teaching; and there was a man there whose right hand was withered.*

(7) *The scribes and the Pharisees were watching Him closely to see if He healed on the Sabbath, so that they might find reason to accuse Him.*

(8) *But He knew what they were thinking, and He said to the man with the withered hand, "Get up and come forward!" And he got up and came forward.*

(9) *And Jesus said to them, "I ask you, is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the Sabbath, to save a life or to destroy it?"*

(10) *After looking around at them all, He said to him, "Stretch out your hand!" And he did so; and his hand was restored.*

(11) *But they themselves were filled with rage, and discussed together what they might do to Jesus.*

Child with a demon healed (At Mount Tabor?)

**Luke 9:37-43** *On the next day, when they came down from the mountain, a large crowd met Him.*

(38) *And a man from the crowd shouted, saying, "Teacher, I beg You to look at my son, for he is my only boy,*

(39) *and a spirit seizes him, and he suddenly screams, and it throws him into a convulsion with foaming at the mouth; and only with difficulty does it leave him, mauling him as it leaves.*

- (40) *"I begged Your disciples to cast it out, and they could not."*
- (41) *And Jesus answered and said, "You unbelieving and perverted generation, how long shall I be with you and put up with you? Bring your son here."*
- (42) *While he was still approaching, the demon slammed him to the ground and threw him into a convulsion. But Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, and healed the boy and gave him back to his father.*
- (43) *And they were all amazed at the greatness of God.....*

#### Blind Bartimaeus healed (At Jericho)

**Luke 18:35-43** *As Jesus was approaching Jericho, a blind man was sitting by the road begging.*

- (36) *Now hearing a crowd going by, he began to inquire what this was.*
- (37) *They told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by.*
- (38) *And he called out, saying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"*
- (39) *Those who led the way were sternly telling him to be quiet; but he kept crying out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"*
- (40) *And Jesus stopped and commanded that he be brought to Him; and when he came near, He questioned him,*
- (41) *"What do you want Me to do for you?" And he said, "Lord, I want to regain my sight!"*
- (42) *And Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well."*
- (43) *Immediately he regained his sight and began following Him, glorifying God; and when all the people saw it, they gave praise to God.*

#### Jesus/Yeshua walks on the sea (At Sea of Galilee)

**John 6:16-21** *Now when evening came, His disciples went down to the sea, (17) and after getting into a boat, they started to cross the sea to Capernaum. It had already become dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them.*

- (18) *The sea began to be stirred up because a strong wind was blowing.*
- (19) *Then, when they had rowed about three or four miles, they \*saw Jesus walking on the sea and drawing near to the boat; and they were frightened.*
- (20) *But He said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid."*
- (21) *So they were willing to receive Him into the boat, and immediately the boat was at the land to which they were going.*

#### Feeding the five thousand (At Bethsaida)

**Luke 9:11-17** *But the crowds were aware of this and followed Him; and welcoming them, He began speaking to them about the kingdom of God and curing those who had need of healing.*

*(12) Now the day was ending, and the twelve came and said to Him, "Send the crowd away, that they may go into the surrounding villages and countryside and find lodging and get something to eat; for here we are in a desolate place."*

*(13) But He said to them, "You give them something to eat!" And they said, "We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless perhaps we go and buy food for all these people."*

*(14) (For there were about five thousand men.) And He said to His disciples, "Have them sit down to eat in groups of about fifty each."*

*(15) They did so, and had them all sit down.*

*(16) Then He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, He blessed them, and broke them, and kept giving them to the disciples to set before the people.*

*(17) And they all ate and were satisfied; and the broken pieces which they had left over were picked up, twelve baskets full.*

**Isaiah 61:1** **The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to captives and freedom to prisoners.**

**John 21:25** **And there are also many other things which Jesus did, which if they were written in detail, I suppose that even the world itself would not contain the books that would be written.**

**John 14:12-14** **"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do, he will do also; and greater works than these he will do; because I go to the Father.**

**(13) "Whatever you ask in My name, that will I do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son.**

**(14) "If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it.**
