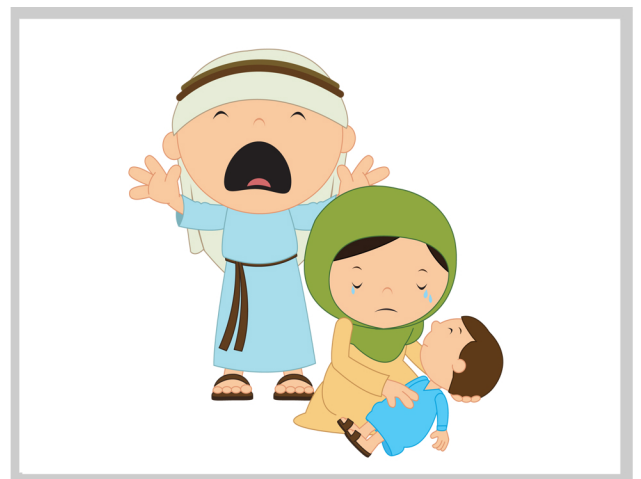
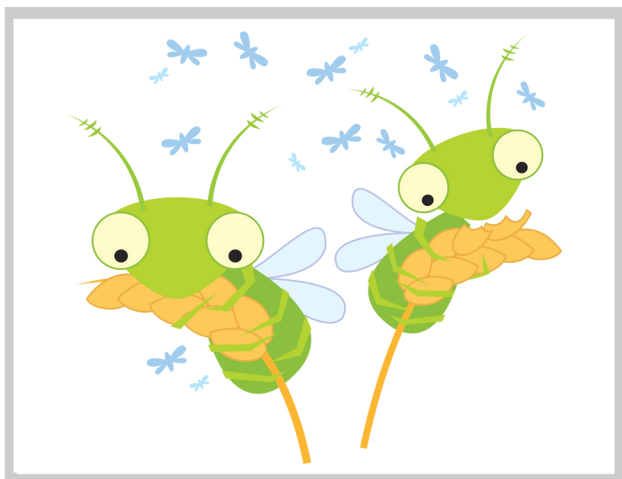
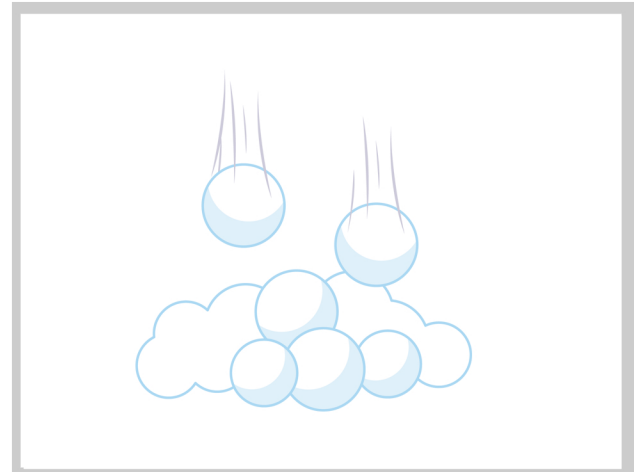
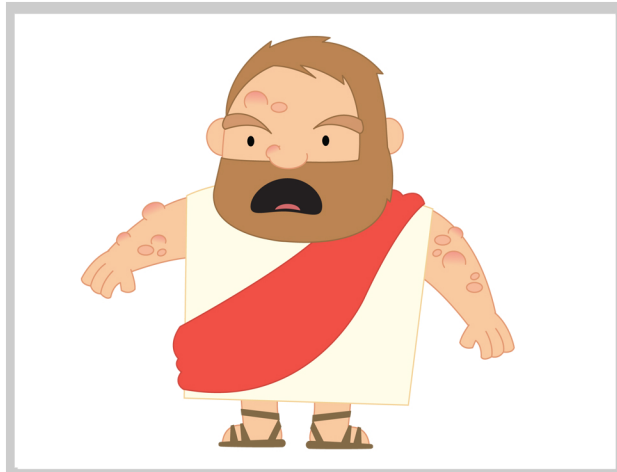
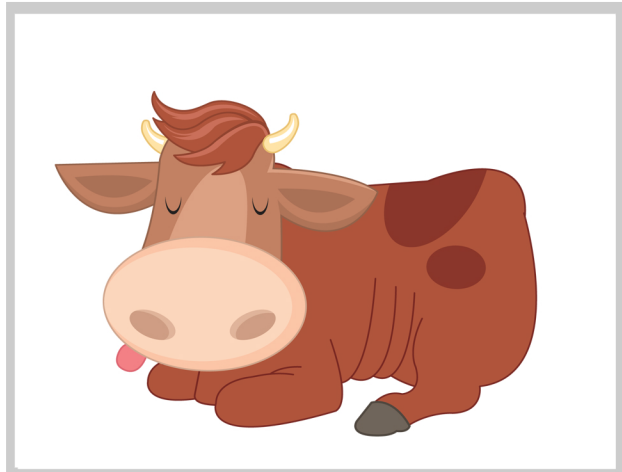
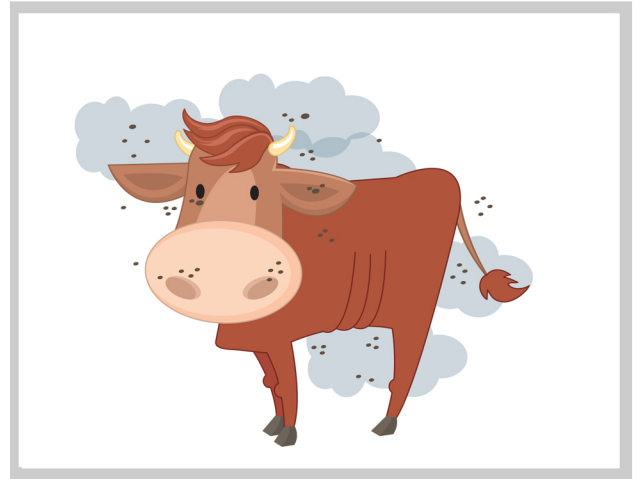
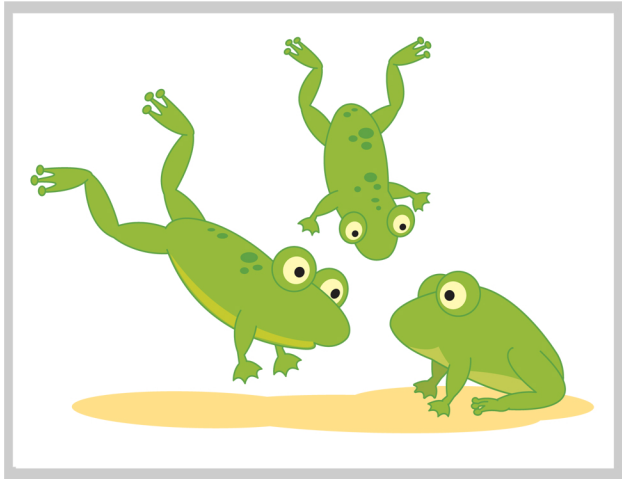
In this Activity Pack you will find :

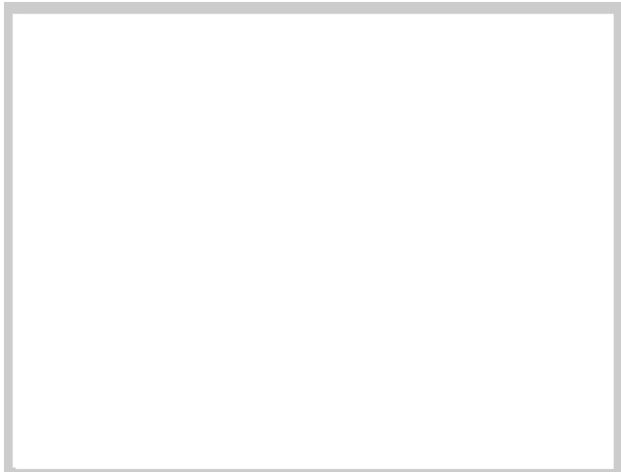
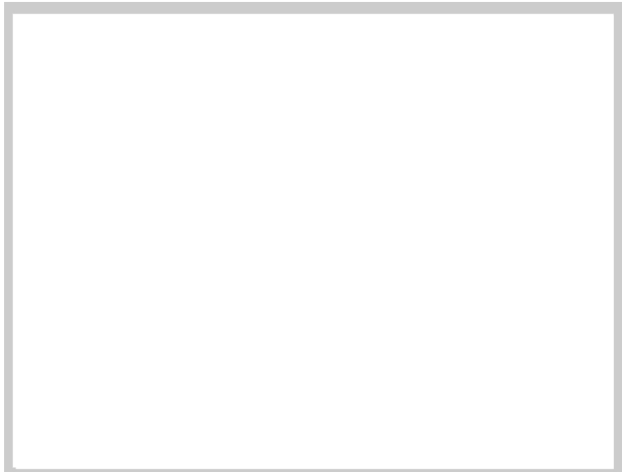
